






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


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Pile Cap Progress

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
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Pile Cap Progress: Poured 11.05.24

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
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




Pile Caps East & West NH: Reduced Dig & Breaking Down Piles












Obstructions / existing foundation removal

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


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Pile cap excavation and existing foundation removal

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




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Existing foundation removal: Steel grillage 13.06.24


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


Existing foundation removal: Steel grillage 13.06.24

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


Pile Caps East & West NH: Reinforcement and waterproofing

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- Nuffield House
 - Nuffield House pile cap formations and removal of existing foundations continued.
- Pegasus House
 - Pegasus House obstructions have been removed.
 - Pegasus House UXO survey was completed.
 - Second phase of underpinning works complete on Sackville Street elevation.
 - 66% of piling completed.
 - Secant pile guide wall completed.

Works completed in previous 12 weeks:

- L-block loading bay at gate 4 was completed.
- Site Boundary
 - Façade access scaffold continues to be erected. Currently 75% complete.
 - Turnstile and new hoarding installed.
 - Perimeter hoarding re-painted.

12 week look ahead



12 week lookahead

Scheduled works for the next 12 weeks:

Substructure works continue.

- Pegasus House piling will complete.
- Pile cap formations in Nuffield House, including the removal of existing foundations, will complete.

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- Pegasus House pile cap formation will commence.
- B2 capping beam construction and temporary prop installation will commence.
- Temporary work installations continue.
 - Excavating / reducing level in Pegasus House for temporary works and piling.
 - Façade access scaffold installation will complete ready for consultant inspection.
 - Tower Crane One erection is scheduled for the weekend of the 3rd & 4th August 2024.

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
- Retained façade scaffold continues.
 - The height of the scaffold structure will increase to the top of the façade retention whilst also extending to encase all three sides.
 - During the installation, a full traffic and pedestrian management plan will be in place to protect the members of the public.
 - As part of this works the hoarding layout will change on Sackville Street to accommodate a fully enclosed site entrance with turnstile and Haki stairs to access the welfare.
- Removal of existing foundations continues.
 - Continue to use best practical methods (stitch drilling, wire saw cutting and pulling)
 - Where breaking is required, noisy works will continue to follow the 2 hours on / 2hours off approach in line with our Section 61 as well as the protocols set out in the Neighbourly Agreements.
- Trench sheet installations as part of temporary works to facilitate drainage and ventilation works


Community engagement

Initiatives

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- McLaren have introduced Alex Talks our Community Liaison Coordinator. Alex will be taking the lead on all community matters, answering all queries relating to the project and ensuring all members of the community are communicated to with updates and relevant information in a timely manner.
- Inspections of the site boundary will be completed daily. Any observations and required actions will be recorded. Alex will also respond to any observations reported by 3rd parties.
- Newsletters and CLG meetings will continue.
- McLaren will be issuing notification to local residents of Saturday works in advance of them taking place with a four week look ahead issued at the same time.
- The works have been sequenced to complete the blockwork on Sackville St. and Albany Court as early as possible to create an additional acoustic and dust barrier.
- Over the coming weeks and months McLaren will constantly review the operations and look at new initiatives to support the community, we will continue to use this meeting as an opportunity to share them.

Observations and Feedback

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In the period, three compliments and one complaint were received.

- Compliments
 - On 21st May, compliments were received following two separate occasions where McLaren team members assisted a member of the public with directions.
 - Field & Dawn, thanked us for our help and cooperation to allow the recent Pride flags to be installed. Following changes to the scaffold system since previous installations took place, new surveys and wind loading calculations were required to ensure the flags could be installed safely. We were grateful for the opportunity to support the local community and agreed to review all the requirements in order for the flags to be installed.
- Complaint
 - On 11th June, reports of vibrations experienced in a neighbouring property. At the time, an excavator was loading soil on to a lorry for removal from site. Following review of the vibration data individual spikes were present.
